General information



There is a moratorium on Evictions for 90 days until June 20th which will most likely be extended by the Governor. You can only be evicted by a NYC Marshall with an order signed by a Housing Court Judge. Since Housing Court is closed there are NO Dispossess or Eviction cases that can be started or continued until after this date.



If you get locked out of your apartment, it is illegal! The Landlord/Super can be arrested for doing this. Call the police to let you back in!



*NOTE: Everyone has been impacted by this crisis and most people are not paying the rent due! Most New Yorkers are buying food and necessities first, before they pay the rent. Rent owed can be paid later.

CON EDISON/utilities

General information



CON EDISON – Utilities Con Edison will Not to shut off Electric and Gas service to any of its customers during this crisis.

Special grants – Emergency assistance – One Shot Deals

In order to apply for a special grant to pay off an overdue bill such as Con Edison or Rent, an application with proof of the debt/unpaid bills (an eviction notice, a shut off notice), monthly household income, assets and other documents are required to submitted to HRA/PA.



The problem with this grant is that generally, you are only allowed to get this emergency grant once a year, hence the name "One Shot Deal". You may also be required to pay it back or get recouped if you already have PA.

Make sure you bring all the bills due (three months plus) since you only have ONE chance a year to receive this grant. Ask for assistance when applying for this grant. HRA has not made any announcements about changing any of the rules for this grant during this crisis.

Unemployment Insurance (UI)

Any Part-Time, Full-Time and self-employed workers* who is unable to work due to a business closing, being laid off, not working due to risk of exposure or infection, quarantined or at home to care for a family member should apply (even if you were not working at the time, APPLY) for Unemployment Insurance. Once approved, you will receive an additional federal \$600 until 7/31/2020. See important information below about applying for UI. APPLY as soon as possible, applying Online is best. Creating a NY.gov ID first makes it easier to apply for unemployment. See below.

Anyone applying for UI will have to create a NY.govID with an email that can NOT be shared with anyone else; NYS will only use one email per person. Also, when applying for UI, use the legal name used on your identification cards like your NYS ID or green card. Once your name is in the system, it can NOT be changed!



One time Stimulus Payment



In general, to receive the onetime payment of up to \$1,200, you must have filed your 2018 or 2019 taxes and earned under \$99,000 for singles and under \$198,000 for married couples.

There is also a one-time payment of \$500 per child. ALL persons claimed on the tax form MUST have a Social Security number(s) to be eligible. Mixed status families and those who applied with an ITIN number(s) are NOT elegible to receive the payment.

After you create an account with your name, email and user name, you will receive an email. Click on the link within 48 hours to verify your email to be able to continue the process. Follow all the instructions to active your NY.gov ID so you can apply for Unemployment easier.
